

How and Where to Find Resources

Books

1. Check the Rochester College Library catalog online <http://www.rc.edu/lib>
2. Check the Mott Library catalog http://www.mcc.edu/7_library/lib_index.shtml
3. Check MelCat for statewide books <http://elibrary.mel.org/search>
4. Check WorldCat to find books that other libraries have.
5. Rochester also has cooperative agreements with <http://www.semlol.org/> and MichiCard

6. To use interlibrary loan through RC, go into WorldCat, look up the book and fill out the ILL form.

Full-text articles

1. If the citation you have found does not have the full-text of the article, go to the Journal Titles A-Z Search. Type in the name of the journal and see if it is full-text in another databases. Then go to the article database list, pick the database and look up the article.
2. If it is not full-text then see who has it in print.

Print journals

1. To see if RC has a journal in print, go to the Print Journal Holdings and click on the list of print journals.
2. To see if another library has a journal in print, use WorldCat.
3. To use interlibrary loan through RC, go into WorldCat, look up the journal title and fill out the ILL form.
